

Terms & Conditions for Clinics Signing Up to the MCCS Principles of Good Practice

By applying to be recognised as a Committed to Good Practice Clinic, you agree to the following:

1. Eligibility

- Clinics must be CQC-registered (or equivalent in devolved nations).
- Clinics must employ or contract at least one GMC-registered specialist prescriber of cannabis-based medicinal products (CBMPs).
- Clinics must agree to uphold the MCCS Principles of Good Practice in prescribing and patient care.

2. Principles of Good Practice

By signing up, clinics confirm that they will:

- Follow the prescribing and governance standards set out in the MCCS Principles of Good Practice.
- Maintain a robust peer approval process for new prescriptions and significant changes.
- Ensure consultations, prescribing, and monitoring meet professional and regulatory expectations.
- Promote transparency, patient choice, and ethical practice at all times.

3. Checks

- Annual Review: Each clinic will undergo an annual check by the MCCS to confirm ongoing compliance.
- Membership: All clinicians working within the clinic will be offered membership of the Society.
- Training: Clinics must ensure that all clinicians involved in medical cannabis care have had access to MCCS training and education.
- Declaration: Clinics must complete an annual checklist, confirming adherence to the MCCS Principles of Good Practice.

4. Use of Logo and Listing

- Clinics recognised as Committed to Good Practice may use the MCCS “Committed to Good Practice” logo on their own websites, promotional materials, and patient information.
- The clinic name will be listed on the MCCS website under Clinics Committed to Good Practice.

5. Listing Options

- Standard Listing: Clinic name published on the MCCS website at no cost.
- Enhanced Listing: Clinics can add their logo, website link, and up to 150 words of copy describing their services for a £500 donation to the Society. This enhanced listing is valid for three years, providing the clinic continues to meet the annual requirements set out in these Terms & Conditions.

6. Removal or Suspension

- Clinics that fail to uphold the MCCS Principles of Good Practice, or fail the annual review, may have their listing suspended or removed.
- The Society reserves the right to refuse or withdraw recognition at its sole discretion where standards are not met.
